What Is Truth?

ostmodernism. A movement in western philosophy that goes back to the late 20th century. What is it? Well, like many things in philosophy, it has a complicated definition. But, in short it is relativism. The inclination to embrace various views or perspectives about any given issue. Sadly, this way of thinking has found its way into Christendom at large. While relativism has certainly been booming in recent years, it is not entirely new.

Notice an interaction between Jesus and Pilate, "Then Pilate said to him, "So you are a king?" Jesus answered, "You say that I am a king. For this purpose I was born and for this purpose I have come into the world—to bear witness to the truth. Everyone who is of the truth listens to my voice." Pilate said to him, "What is truth?" After he had said this, he went back outside to the Jews and told them, "I find no guilt in him." (John 18:37-38, ESV).

Pilate asks the question, "what is truth?" Whether or not he asked this question sincerely is unknown. However, we do know there was great philo-



sophical and religious diversity in the first century. So, it would not be a stretch to understand Pilate as saying "who can know the truth?" How many today feel that way? With so many opinions, religions, and philosophies, navigating this world is overwhelming. Even when we narrow it down to just Christianity, it can be overwhelming. Can we know the truth? Is

there even definitive truth to be known?

The answer to both questions is unequivocally, yes. Jesus gives us the answer to both questions in the gospel of John. In John 8:31-32, we are told that if we continue in Jesus' word, we will be His disciples and know the truth. Nine chapters later in John 17:17 we read of Jesus' prayer the night he was betrayed. In that verse He asks the Father to sanctify His disciples by God's truth. He then defines that by saying "your word is truth". This certainly applies to the written revelation, but it also applies to Jesus Himself for He is the Word (John 1:1). Therefore, if we know Jesus, we know truth.

Postmodernism is very popular and alluring in these confusing religious times. However, let us always guard ourselves with the words of Christ. Constantly reminding one another that through Jesus, we can know the truth.
